Open to all parents/guardians who want to learn how to keep their children safe online. During that school day there will be specially arranged workshops for pupils from 2nd-6th classes facilitated by ZEEKO.

This programme supports parents to encourage and promote positive mental health and wellbeing in their children. The programme also explores how the building of resilience in children helps them to manage and cope with the day to day stresses of life as they occur.



Internet Safety Workshops Tues. April 30th at 7pm

The Board of Management and Parents Council have agreed to share the costs related to providing these special Internets Safety Workshops for all of the pupils in our school from 2nd to 6th class.

During the school day on April 30th the pupils in each of these classes will be taken for a 1 hour session where topics such as internet safety, online gaming, social media, inappropriate content, digital footprint and cyber bullying will be dealt with.

We have employed an educational training company, Zeeko, who are specialists in the field of internet safety. As well as working with the pupils throughout the school day, the staff of the school will also receive training and support when the pupils have gone home at 3pm. The staff training will go on for about an hour.

On that same evening the facilitators will return to the school at 7pm for a presentation and talk specially designed for parents/guardians of primary school children.

Book Rental Scheme

Several parents are availing of the Easy Pay Facility to take the pain out of paying for school books for the new school year. Mrs Hurley runs the Book Rental Scheme in our school and parents/guardians are advised to pay the school book rental fee as soon as possible. The cost is €95 per child with reductions for siblings. This covers school books and workbooks, art and craft supplies, printing and photocopying for the year.

There is also a small additional charge for the Textaparent Service (≤ 5) — this is an essential communication tool and we hope that all parents will support the service. Please download the free <u>Textaparent App</u> on your phone as this saves the school money and reduces the cost of texts.

School Building Work Update

We are finally at the point where the building work on our school has been completed. There is some landscaping to be done around the school and we hope to get that finished over the Easter holidays. The staff car park is now open to staff members and visitors to the school so that will free up some additional parking in the church car park and it won't be necessary for drivers to park on the road. We would remind drivers that they must not block the drop off lane outside the school and that traffic must be allowed to flow freely. We hope that the traffic lights will be connected up soon – we are waiting for one of the electricity supply companies to do this.

There are now quite strict regulations in the area of Child Protection & Safeguarding and consequently visitors to the school must be accompanied by a member of staff when in the school building or grounds.
