• Feb. 15th (Mon.) – <u>MARATHON MONDAY</u>: - (An Active School Activity)



All of the children in the school will be involved in running a full marathon today (weather permitting). Each child will run a part of the race and then pass the baton on to the next child until the full 40kms has been run. The pupils in Junior & Senior Infants, First & Second Classes will run 100m each, the $3^{rd} \& 4^{th}$ class pupils will run 150m each and the $5^{th} \& 6^{th}$ class pupils will run 200m. Each child will be asked to bring in $\in 1$ which will be donated to CHILDLINE. There will also be a competition to guess the time that it will take to finish the marathon. It will be $\in 1$ per guess and there will be a <u>Smyths Voucher</u> for the time closest to the finish time.

For the last few years we have organised a skipathon in our school. All of the children are involved and there are team and individual prizes. In the team competition each team is made up of pupils from Junior Infants to 6th class (two pupils from each class in each team). Each team member skips for 60 seconds and the team with the highest number of skips is the winner. We also have an individual skipping prize for the best skipper in each class. Skipping in an excellent way to keep fit and we hope that by promoting this activity we can improve the level of fitness in our pupils. *Please encourage your child to practice skipping at home over the next few months.*

<u>Guided Reading Programme</u>

The pupils in Mrs Sweeney's 1st Class are involved in a Guided Reading programme at the moment. This will run for a period of 5 weeks. From Monday-Thursday, the children are divided into small reading groups of 6 pupils who are reading at the same level. A teacher then works with each group for 35 minutes, focusing in on reading fluency, comprehension and oral language.





<u>MATHLETICS</u>

It's wonderful to see that nearly 160 pupils in our school have now signed up to Mathletics this year. This is a great way for your child to work on their Maths skills at home and it really helps reinforce Maths concepts that they have learned in class. MATHLETES / LearnStorm

Last year our school was involved in an inter-school Mathematics competition called Mathletes. Over the course of 9 weeks the pupils in 4th, 5th & 6th class had the opportunity to compete in online Maths activities against other pupils and schools all over Ireland. We were delighted when Scoil Naomh Feichín won the award for the best primary school in County Louth and we were really proud of our individual winners Abby Rice and Neda Totilaite.



This year the competition is back with a new name – <u>LearnStorm</u>. The competition will be launched on Jan. 29^{th} and there has already been quite a lot of publicity about it. ART CLASSES @ SCOIL NAOMH FEICHÍN

During the summer holidays last year a number of pupils from our school attended an Art Summer Camp at Listoke House, Ballymakenny, facilitated by artist Niamh Carroll (*B.A. Hons. In Visual Arts Practice*). Following our return to school in September, Niamh enquired if our school would like to host a series of Art Classes after school. At the time we were unable to arrange this but I would now like to gauge if there is sufficient interest in arranging these classes for our pupils.

The classes would take place on a Monday, 3.10pm-4.10pm, and would go on for about 6 weeks. All art supplies would be provided and the number in the class would be limited. The cost per class is $\pounds 12$ per pupil. This activity is available to pupils in $3^{rd} - 6^{th}$ classes.

The content of the classes would be as follows:

- ✓ Artist referenced Piet Mondrain, Bridget Riley, Sinead Smith -Students learn shape colour and composition using markers, rulers with a grid system.
- ✓ Collage with portraiture reference Andy Warhol, Picasso. Students create their own fun portraiture.
- ✓ Create cartoon story (characters or comics) Reference Roy Lichtenstein / Alan Nolan.
