School Extension Update

Finally some good news regarding the proposed school extension and refurbishment project..... The Department of Education & Skills has officially informed the Board of Management that *"it is in order for the project to proceed to Stage 3 (Tender Action)"*. This means that that our architects will <u>immediately</u> forward detailed tender documents to the pre-qualified contractors. Once the tenders are returned, a preliminary tender report is submitted to the Board of



Management who then forward it to the Department for consideration. When the Department has examined the report, a letter subsequently issues to the board and a contractor is appointed to carry out the work. We are very hopeful that all of the above will be carried out in an efficient manner and that there will be no further delays with this project. Many thanks to all those who wrote letters and emails, signed the petition and made representations on the school's behalf – your support is invaluable.

School Awarded Fifth Green Flag & Drogheda Corporation Trophy We were absolutely delighted to be informed that Scoil Naomh Feichín was one of the schools awarded a Green Flag for BIODIVERSITY. This is the school's fifth environmental flag and it recognises the huge effort of the Green School Committee over the last two years. An Taisce has previously awarded the school with Green Flags for Water Conservation, Energy Awareness, Litter Prevention and Travel. Green School Coordinator, Mrs Cassidy, attended the Green School Awards Ceremony in The Helix, DCU, along with three members of the hard-working Green School Committee. In the Louth County Council Grow Awards for Primary Schools, Scoil Naomh Feichín, was announced as the overall winner in the South Louth area. The Drogheda Corporation sponsored cup was presented to the winning school at the end of year county environment awards held in Dundalk. The role of school caretaker, Eamon Murphy, in maintaining the school grounds to such a high standard was a significant factor in the judges' decision.
