New Board of Management

The process of forming a new Board of Management for our school in now almost complete. At a recent meeting of parents, Ciara Foley and Neil Martin were elected as parent nominees on the new board. Also included in the board will be two teachers, two Patron's nominees and two community nominees. The first meeting of the board will take place on December 8th in the school.

School Extension Announcement

CONSTRUCTION Last week we finally received confirmation from the Department of Education & Skills that our long-awaited school extension is on the construction list for 2016. All of the architectural drawings, tender documents and statutory certificates have been approved by the Department and planning permission has been secured from Louth County Council. Funding will be provided for a 7 classroom extension and sports hall and the current school building will also be renovated and modernised. The project will take approximately 18 months to complete.

I would like to acknowledge the support of a number of local public representatives who have been supportive of this project over the last few years. I will of course keep parents up to date with developments over the coming months.

Parent Teacher Meetings

Thank you to all parents who came along to the parent-teacher meetings last week. We hope that the meetings were constructive and informative. Your child's teacher may have offered some advice about homework and how best you can support your child's learning at home. It was also an opportunity for you to ask questions of your child's teacher and to get a progress report. As part of the commemoration ceremonies for the Easter Rising of 1916, two soldiers from the Irish Army visited the school earlier this month to talk to the pupils about this special event. During their visit the Proclamation was read and the school was presented with the Irish Tricolour which will be flown for the first time on March 16th 2016.

MATHLETICS

Don't forget to enrol your child in the excellent online Maths programme, Mathletics. NNRIT & Standardised Testing

In the summer term standardised testing is carried out in all classes except Junior and Senior Infants. Pupils are tested in Numeracy and Literacy using tests which are extensively used in other primary schools around the country. The results of these tests are communicated to parents in end of year reports. Parents also receive an information leaflet to help interpret the results. The outcome of these tests also inform teachers planning for the next school year.

In addition to the above tests, a Non-Reading Intelligence Test is administered in 1st class and again in 5th class. By using the data from these tests, teachers are better able to support the learning needs of the pupils in their classes and pupils who would benefit from some additional learning support are identified.



SCHOOL BOOK FAIR (Nov. 23-27th)

Following a very successful MS Readathon where the children raised £3,269.89 for charity, the School Book Fair will be taking place in our school all this week. Parent and pupils will have the opportunity to choose from a wide variety of recommended children's books. Any books that are not available on the shelves can be ordered and will be delivered to the school over the next week or two. Parents will be able to visit the Book Fair each day from 3pm-3.30pm and on Wednesday from 8.45am -9.10am.

NEW LANGUAGE CURRICULUM

Following the introduction recently of a new school curriculum in Religious Education, we have been informed that an updated Language Curriculum will be launched in the new school year. School principals are being invited to an information seminar on this new curriculum over the coming weeks.

FIT KIDS PERFORMANCES

The children in Senior Infants and 4th classes are thoroughly enjoying the Fit Kids sessions every Friday with Jacinta and Niamh. They are working very hard on their routines at the moment as the performances for their parents and school friends are only a few weeks away.
