Fáilte ar ais - Welcome back to School




Parent Teacher Meetings

However if you would like to speak to your child's teacher before that about any concern that you may have or to check on your child's progress at school, an appointment can be arranged with the class teacher or learning support teacher.

School Extension & Renovation Project

Construction work on our school building project has finally commenced. The site for the seven classrooms, sports hall, special education rooms, offices, staffroom and ancillary accommodation has now been cleared and foundations are being dug this week. The main contractor for this project is CJ Callan & Co., Ardee.









Safety during the Construction Phase

Safety in and around the school is a significant concern for us during the construction of our new building. At the initial site meetings with the main contractor, architects and safety consultants, we have stressed that everything possible must be done to ensure that the pupils in our school can access the school safely each morning and leave safely in the afternoon. We have insisted that there will be <u>no deliveries</u> to the site between the following times each day:

8.45 am - 9.30 am / 1.50 pm - 2.10 pm / 2.50 pm - 3.15 pm

We recommend that parents who are dropping off the children in the morning to please use the <u>drop off zone</u> in the staff carpark. Please do not double park on the roadway. Parents also have access to the church carpark during dropping off and picking up times. We would ask parents and pupils to cross carefully from the school to the church carpark and to use the footpath on the school side of the road until they can cross directly across to the church carpark.

In addition, we are considering the option of a staggered finish to the school day with some of the classes who normally finish at 3pm finishing at 2.50pm to help lessen the congestion around the school at those times. We will monitor the situation over the next week or two and reassess the arrangements then.

Over the next few weeks all classes will be doing Road Safety lessons and activities.
