As usual our school will join with Scoil Mhuire gan Smál, Cartown for the parish Confirmation ceremony. Altogether 71 pupils will be confirmed on that day. Consequently, access to the church will be limited. More information will be circulated to 6th class families this week.

We entered a mixed team of boys and girls and played our matches at Naas Tennis Club on April 27th. In our section were teams from Churchill NS, (Kilkenny), Kilashee NS (Kildare) and Curragha NS (Meath). We will also be running some tennis coaching in the school over the next 6 weeks with the junior classes. The pupils in $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}} - \mathbf{6}^{\text{th}}$ classes will be doing their annual standardised tests in Maths & English in mid-May. Results will be included in the end of year school reports.

Gaelic Games

Every year Mrs Fahy and Ms McAuley do terrific work with the Gaelic football teams in our school. The boys and girls teams participate in the Cumann na mBunscol primary schools leagues and the teachers arrange regular training sessions for the pupils in the senior classes. Ms Campbell and Mr Casey also help out with the teams. We are also very fortunate that our local GAA club, **St Fechin's GFC** are very supportive and the club arranges for coaches to come to the school to teach the basic skills of hurling and football to the younger children. Louth County Board also provide hurling and football coaches who help with the coaching of young players in school throughout the year.

TENNIS

Tennis is a wonderful game for children of all ages. We are promoting the game by arranging coaching for four of the junior classes. We will employ a qualified tennis coach who will supply all of the equipment needed for the coaching sessions. We would love to see more of our pupils joining the local tennis club in An Grianán and making use of it over the summer months. Ideally we would like to enter the Leinster Primary Schools Tennis League every year but unfortunately we have a shortage of tennis players at the moment. So, please consider encouraging your children to play the game and get involved in the coaching programme at Termonfeckin Tennis Club.



Our girls and boys participated in the FAI Primary Schools soccer tournaments in Dundalk earlier this year. Now that the weather is starting to improve and our school field is playable, Mr McCann is planning to start soccer coaching sessions after school.
