
# <u>School Newsletter – Jan 2018</u>

On this Sunday we will have a special FAMILY MASS in Termonfeckin to launch Catholic Schools Week.

The pupils from both of our parish schools are invited to come along with their families to 11am Mass at the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Termonfeckin.

Ireland has been chosen by Pope Francis to host the World Meeting of Families 2018. From Aug 21-26, families and others from all over the world will gather in Dublin to celebrate their lives together, to share their experiences from different parts of the world, to reflect on the different challenges they face and to grow together in faith. This event presents a special opportunity for school families to not only celebrate the fact that parents are the primary educators of their children, but also the vital role that Catholic schools play in assisting parents in their duty to raise their children.

The children are doing really well so far this year and it's great to see so much fruit and vegetables included in the school lunches. The only drinks that are permitted are water and milk. ### **Shortage of Substitute Teachers**

There has been quite a lot of media coverage recently about the chronic shortage of qualified substitute primary teachers at the moment, particularly along the east coast. This is beginning to create problems for us at our school as it can be very difficult to source a substitute teacher in the event of a teacher being absent due to illness.

From time to time, no substitute teacher is available at all and we have to either split up the class and send small groups to other classrooms or arrange for one of the special education teachers or principal to teach the class for the day. None of these solutions are acceptable but nevertheless we are occasionally forced to do this.

Over the course of the year there are very beneficial courses and workshops which teachers can attend in the area of Child Protection and Teaching & Learning but unfortunately sometimes we have to withdraw from attending these courses as there is no one available to take a teacher's class.

The principal has written to the Minister for Education & Skills, the INTO, IPPN and IPPN to highlight this unacceptable situation. Unfortunately, there is going to be no easy solution, in the short term.
