### New School Admissions 2021

Enrolment applications for new junior infants and other classes will be accepted from December 8<sup>th</sup> 2020 until January 31<sup>st</sup> 2021. Some parents have already completed and returned an <u>Intention to Enrol Form</u> for their child and we will be in contact with these parents with more information about the enrolment process. All Irish primary schools have been required, by legislation, to update their <u>Admissions Policies</u> this year. The process for the enrolment of new pupils is therefore different than previous years. The school will publish an <u>Admissions Notice</u> on the school website at the end of November so please alert any parents in the area that you think may want to enroll their child in our school for the new school year 2020/21.

### School Uniforms

We are very proud of our beautiful school uniform and the pupils look very smart when they wear it.

Please remember that your child should wear their school uniform <u>every day</u> unless their teacher has arranged a sports or PE activity. Occasionally, uniforms may need to be washed during the week and in these circumstance it's okay for a pupil to wear their tracksuit to school. However, if your child's uniform is clean and dry it should be worn every day.





### **Credit Union**

Our friends at Termonfeckin Credit Union arrange to collect weekly savings from pupils in our school <u>every Tuesday</u>. Savings books are returned later in the week. If you would like your child to start saving with the local Credit Union let the class teacher know and the relevant forms will be sent home.

### **Gaelic Football Coaching**





Our school has a very strong tradition of Gaelic games and we're delighted that Sean Hand has been carrying out weekly coaching in Gaelic Football with a variety of classes since the school reopened at the end of August. Sean is a qualified GAA coach and these coaching sessions are completely funded by Louth GAA. Due to COVID restrictions all coaching this year must be carried out in the sports field or in the school playground.

# Important Information about COVID-19 for Parents

### Please do everything you can to ensure that all of our pupils and staff remain healthy and well.

### How to protect your child from COVID-19

To infect you, the virus has to get from an infected person's nose or mouth into your eyes, nose or mouth. This can happen if someone who has the virus coughs or sneezes near you or if you touch something they have been in contact with, such as an object or a surface.

It is important that you:

- $\checkmark$  Wash your hands properly and often
- ✓ Practice social distancing
- ✓ Cover coughs and sneezes

# When its okay to send your child to school

If your child is not a close contact, it is usually okay to send them to primary school if they -

- $\checkmark$  Only have nasal symptoms, such as a runny nose or a sneeze
- ✓ Do not have a <u>high temperature</u> and are not taking any form of paracetamol or ibuprofen this can hide a temperature
- ✓ Do not have a new cough
- ✓ Do not live with anyone who is unwell and may have COVID-19
- ✓ Have been told by a GP that it's OK to go back to school or childcare if they have recently been unwell.
- ✓ Have got a <u>negative COVID-19 test result</u> and have not had symptoms for 48 hours
- ✓ have not had diarrhoea for 48 hours
- ✓ Are being tested as part of a <u>serial testing programme</u>, but have no symptoms and are not a close contact. For example, some children in direct provision centres
- ✓ Are tested regularly because they are in a vulnerable group.

### When to keep your child at home from school

Do not send your child to school or childcare if any of the following apply. Your child has:

- ✓ A temperature of 38 degrees Celsius or more
- ✓ Any other common symptoms of COVID-19 a new cough, loss or changed sense of taste or smell, shortness of breath or an existing breathing condition that has recently become worse
- ✓ Been in <u>close contact</u> with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19
- ✓ Been living with someone who is unwell and may have COVID-19
- ✓ Other uncommon symptoms of COVID-19, such as sore throat or headaches diarrhoea
- ✓ Returned from another country in the last 14 days

# What to do if your child is a Close Contact

If your child has been identified as a close contact, it means they have been in contact with someone who has Covid-19.

Your child must restrict their movements for 14 days, since they were last in close contact with the person who has tested positive for Covid-19. The HSE will tell you the date the 14 days of restricted movements will finish.

Restricting movements means avoiding contact with other people and social situations as much as possible.

During the 14 days restricted movements your child cannot:

- attend school, childcare or any group activities
- use public transport
- visit other people's homes or have visitors to your home

Your child can go outside to attend a medical appointment or to exercise as long as they keep 2 metres distance from other people.

# What to do if your child is a Close Contact (Negative Test Result)

If your child, who is a close contact with no symptoms of COVID-19, receives a negative result, they still need to restrict their movements:

• for 14 days, or

• until the date you were told to restrict their movements. This is because it can take up to two weeks to develop infection of COVID-19.

# What to do if your child is a Close Contact (Positive Test Result)

Your child will need to self-isolate (stay in their room) if their test result is positive (COVID-19 virus found). People in your household will need to restrict their movements (stay at home) for 14 days. Household siblings cannot attend school and adults at home should not go to work.

You, or whoever is the main carer of the child in self-isolation, will need to restrict your movements for 17 days. This includes the 10 days that your child is in isolation and for 7 days after your child's isolation period ends. Your child must self-isolate until:

- they have not had a high temperature (38 degrees Celsius or over) for 5 days AND
- it has been 10 days since they first developed symptoms

If your child has no symptoms, they can stop self-isolating 10 days from the date of their test

### **Safety Measures at School**

It is not common for a child to pass the virus on to other children in school.

Children who do get the virus, usually get it from adults. This is particularly true for children under the age of 13. Measures in schools to reduce the risk include:

- ✓ Hand hygiene
- ✓ Enhanced cleaning measures throughout the school building
- ✓ Reduced mixing between children
- ✓ Fewer objects going in and out of school

# If your child has symptoms of Covid-19, please immediately isolate your child and ring your GP.
