School & Covid-19

We are immensely grateful for the wonderful support and cooperation of our parents and pupils over the last two years. The challenges that we've encountered in our school since March 2020 have been unprecedented, but hopefully, we are nearing an end to this terrible experience for all of our school families and staff. The control measures that we were required to put in place to protect everyone's health and wellbeing are still being implemented and we are awaiting a government announcement at the end of the month to see if there will be any easing of these measures in schools.

Even though we're looking forward to healthier months ahead, we need to appreciate that we're currently experiencing a spike in cases among pupils in certain class groups as well as among individual members of our teaching staff. The chronic shortage of qualified substitute teachers has made the task of managing the school very difficult indeed but we're doing everything we possibly can to limit the level of disruption for our pupils. All members of staff in our school deserve great credit for the levels of flexibility and resilience that they've displayed over the last two years.

New Special Class



We will be opening a special class for children with autism after the summer break. The Board of Management has approved an Admissions Policy and applications are currently being accepted for this new class. The final date for receipt of applications is March 7th 2022. The Admissions Notice, Application Form and Enrolment Policy for this new special class are all available on the school website. A great deal of work will have to be done over the coming months to establish this new class in our school and we look forward to welcoming the new pupils at the end of August 2022.

School Inspection

An inspector from the Department of Education carried out a "Supporting the Safe Provision of Schooling Inspection" in December 2021. The checks conducted during this inspection were based on the Covid-19 Response Plan and compliance with government guidelines.

The school inspector also carried out a number of checks to evaluate how the child protection and safeguarding procedures are being implemented in the school.

The inspector found that the school was fully compliant in all areas covered by the inspection and the inspection report has now been published on the Department of Education website.
