It has been an absolute whirlwind start to the new school year over the last six weeks – the busiest September & October that I have experienced in my time as a teacher.

We have thoroughly enjoyed welcoming all of our pupils back after the summer break and we've extended an especially warm welcome to our new pupils in Junior Infants, our new pupils in other classes and some new Ukrainian pupils who have enrolled in our school.

We currently have 297 pupils in our school and this number is likely to increase over the coming months and years. Due to the increased number of pupils attending our school, we will gradually be able to increase the number of teachers we have in the school. Unfortunately, even though our current enrolment qualifies us for an additional class teacher, we have to wait until the start of 2024/25 to employ this extra teacher. Consequently, there are some classes which are currently quite large but hopefully, we will address this problem when more teachers are sanctioned for our school.

AED Defibrillator Training

Just before the midterm break, all members of our school staff engaged in a refresher training workshop on the use of defibrillators and emergency response measures. Both of the AED units in the school are maintained and serviced annually and the external unit on the front wall of the school is available for use at all times, even when the school is closed.
